

## Minor in Women's Health Issues

The 21 unit Minor in Women's Health Issues is a natural complement to a variety of majors such as Nursing, Health Education, Counseling, Psychology, Urban Studies, or other human services careers. The minor offers three areas of focus: (1) theory about women's social roles and status implications for women's health; (2) organizing and managing health services, health education, and health delivery systems; and (3) politics, policy analysis, and strategies for changing women's health policies. Students take a core course in each of these areas, then choose three electives which may be concentrated within one area or drawn from several areas, and then complete a culminating research project or internship.
